Basic Survey Information:

- Date survey sent: March 15, 2016
- Announced survey end date: April 6, 2016
- Number of classmates sent survey via email: 57
- Number of classmates receiving survey via email (address valid): 49
- Number of classmates completing survey: 27
- Number of classmates opting out of completing survey: 2
- Number of reminders sent to those who did not complete survey: 1

Survey Monkey is the firm used to distribute the survey because:

- Cost = \$0.00 if the survey consisted of 10 or fewer questions and was limited to 100 or less respondents
- Offered confidentiality to respondents (we would not know who provided responses) if they DID NOT respond to Question #10.
- Collected and tabulated responses
- Can be used for unlimited number of surveys in the future
- Can be upgraded (more questions, more people, perform analytics, etc.) for a fee
